

Old Timers Pool League

2024-2025

- 1) Sponsor fee is \$25 per team.
- 2) The season will begin, Thursday, September 12th, 2024.
- 3) Packets will be delivered the week prior to play, so be sure your sponsor is aware of the packet fees.
- 4) The matches start at **noon** in the home bar as is designated on the schedule.
- 5) Our rules are simply, straight eight.
 - a) We all know what that means;
 - i) no fouls
 - ii) no ball-in-hand.
- 6) When a player scratches, the incoming player must shoot from inside the kitchen.
 - a) Exception is the 8 ball.
 - i) That is a loss of game
- 7) If you make a ball on the break, that is what you have, unless you scratch!
 - a) In that case, the opponent makes their choice by pocketing a ball
 - i) from the kitchen.
- 8) If a player makes a ball and scratches, the incoming player may pull one of his own balls and shoot.
 - a) Exception 8 ball (loss of game)
 - b) If all balls, of the incoming player, are in the kitchen, that shooter has the **option** to spot a ball.
 - i) The spotted ball must be the ball closest to the head string.
 - c) If he makes 2 and scratches, the incoming player may pull 2 of his or her balls and begin shooting (from the kitchen) and so on
 - i) This does not include the eight ball. It must be shot!
- 9) Eight on the break is a win
 - a) unless you scratch...that is a loss.

- 10) If a ball stops in the jaws and the player leaves the playing area and it then, falls; it is replaced as close to where it was, as possible and the incoming player continues to shoot.
- 11) If an object ball jumps the table, it is spotted, as closely to the spot as is possible.
- 12) Teams that are short players, may pick up a shooter from the bar they are in. This will be called the 'pick-up rule' That player need not be 50 years old or added to their roster.
 - a) During the match, **a full team** may not apply the 'pick-up rule' to use a shooter that is not going to be added to their team roster.
 - b) Teams that are short, cannot use the 'pick-up rule' to fill their team, with any player that is not either
 - i) on the opposing team
 - ii) approved by the opposing team.

Pool is a game of gentlemen...remember that and, most importantly, have fun!
